Routines

Outdoor learning - On warm and dry days, we are happy for children to attend forest school without their waterproof clothing. Please, however, continue to provide your children with wellies on these days. Just a reminder that we attend Forest School on **Tuesday mornings** and **Friday afternoons**.

Indoor PE - We will be continuing our PE sessions from the first week back, on Monday mornings and Thursday afternoons. Please remember to send children to school wearing their PE kit, which consists of a navy or black shorts/jogging bottoms, a white polotop/t-shirt, and trainers.

Our Topic: In the Garden!

This half-term, our topic is In the Garden. We will be learning facts about a wide variety of minibeasts; exploring the school grounds in search of minibeasts; thinking about the types of plants that we may find in our gardens and on our school grounds; and we will be spending a few weeks focusing on bees! To kick off the topic, we will spend the first week back reading The Very Hungry Caterpillar by Eric Carle. We will continue to learn new Makaton signs each week, starting with 'caterpillar'. Don't forget to ask your children to teach you the new words and signs at home!

If you have any books related to the topic of In the Garden at home that you are happy to share with us, please bring these into Nursery and let one of the Nursery team know.

Maths

We will continue to send home learning links home with your children at the end of each week that relate to the maths learning of that week. Please engage with these activities at home with your children. If you have any questions about the home learning, please do not he sitate to ask Miss Kavanagh for help or advice.

Family wall

We still have space on our family wall, so please bring in a photo of your lovely families for us to stick up.
