Our Learning Journey

History: Medical Marvels

This half-term, we will be learning about the history of medicine through our Medical Marvels topic. We will be looking at the differences and similarities of how diseases were understood and treated, from Ancient Greece to the Victorians.

English

Reading

We will continue to the follow the whole class model of teaching reading, beginning with our new novel 'How High the Moon' by Karyn Parsons. We will also be reading non-fiction texts linked to our Medical Marvel topic including a biography of Marie Curie and information texts about Leprosy and Chromatography. We would, as always, encourage you to read with your child on a regular basis.

Writing

Our current topic is a non-fiction unit about nonchronological reports. By the end of the topic, the children will be able to write a non-chronological report using a range of sentence structures and literary devices.

Maths

Our maths learning this half term includes:

Money

- Explaining and representing money
- Comparing money
- · Converting between pounds and pence
- Adding and subtracting money

Negative numbers

- Interpreting numbers greater than and less than zero in different contexts
- · Reading and writing negative numbers
- Explaining how the value of a number relates to its position from zero
- Identifying and placing negative numbers on a number line
- Interpreting sets of negative and positive numbers in a range of contexts
- Using knowledge of positive and negative numbers to calculate intervals
- Explaining how negative numbers are used on a coordinate grid
- Using knowledge of positive and negative numbers to interpret graphs

Science

This term, the children will be learning about the properties and uses of everyday materials.
